Our Weekly News

Dear Friends

This is the Church's twentieth newsletter of 2020, which makes five months in total and so quite a milestone! And it's been a rather eventful week on the island too ...

It was revealed during the last week that we have two new cases of Covid-19 on the island - the first was someone returning from French Guyana (French Guyana still has a high incidence of Covid-19), and the second was a resident whose infection seems to have been contracted while on Dutch St Martin. So the virus is around, just like across the rest of the world! We are thus once again reminded of the need to take precautions seriously – which can be no bad thing, as people on the island seemed to be getting a bit lax.

The number of cases has also increased this past week on both sides of St Martin; and France has restricted the Dutch-French border crossing to those travelling for medical or professional reasons or in transit to the airport.

At the same time, we had the threat of a storm hitting the island, which doesn't usually happen before September. Nonetheless, experience has taught us to be cautious, so we all closed our hurricane shutters in readiness for bad weather. Fortunately, when it got to St Barts it was only a Tropical Wave (which

is the precursor of a hurricane, without the circulatory motion that increases the wind factor); but it brought 24 hours of heavy rain, wind and some big waves. It did not merit a name at that time; but, sadly, it has since gained strength as well as the title 'Isaias' – and we send our prayers to those in The Bahamas and Florida, and all others in its path.

This week we have Father Steve Huber celebrating our virtual service with us once again; this time from his home in Palm Springs. And don't forget, you can follow along by downloading the pdf of our Service Booklet – there is link below and in the YouTube video description.

Our music this week starts off with one of our favourites – *Be Still and Know that I am God* – with a video entering the Church (albeit still with a few shutters closed!). For our post sermon meditation, we have a beautiful piece that featured in a concert at the Church a few years ago, and was performed by Ombeline Collin (violin) and Alexandre Luquet (guitar) accompanying Caitlin Alexander's beautiful voice (many will remember Caitlin's husband, Sebastien, who often played his wooden flutes for us in Church). And our closing song is a popular number, which was often sung by La Chorale, *O Happy Day*; but as I don't have a recording of them singing, I have included a video of another choir – it's such a joyful tune.

At 10am on Sunday, we will hold our usual Zoom Coffee Morning (details below). The subject for discussion, inspired by this week's musical selection, is to recall any poignant music or concert that we may have heard in our Church over the years.

We are only too aware how difficult it is for everyone to cope with this virus and the effects it is having on us, our friends and families, our health care workers and health systems, as well businesses and economies everywhere. So we continue to pray for all those who have been, and continue to be, affected.


